




CHEYENNE COUNTY

PERCENTAGE OF STUDENTS IN SPECIAL EDUCATION







Student Moved Once During School Year



Student Moved Twice or More During School Year










AVERAGE YEARS OF TEACHING EXPERIENCE







2017 ACT Scores
