We are thrilled to share some fantastic news with you all: Leyton Public School has been selected as a recipient of the Nebraska Early Childhood Grant. This grant was a competitive grant that our district applied for with the hopes of adding a much needed preschool to our school district. I realize that preschool is something that we have attempted to get off the ground before, but this time the stars appear to have aligned with community support as well as funding for the program. I would like to take some time to inform everyone on the vision of our program, the funding, program goals and most importantly how we sustain the program so our community can view this program as money well spent after the grant funding is exhausted.

Starting next year, we will be hosting a preschool in Gurley that will operate four full days a week, Monday through Thursday using the normal school hours. This initiative is a significant step forward in our commitment to providing the best possible educational opportunities for all children in our community, as well as meeting the components included in our vision "cultivate lifelong learners". The vision we have set for this program is clear: we aim to deliver an exceptional preschool experience that equips every child with the skills and confidence they need to thrive as they transition into formal schooling. With this grant, we believe we are leveling the playing field for early childhood education in our community, ensuring that every child has access to high-quality early learning experiences. To ensure the success of this program, we are proud to announce our partnership with HeadStart, an organization dedicated to early childhood education. Together, we will combine our resources and expertise to create a nurturing and enriching environment for our preschool students.

When it comes to funding the program the grant will provide the district with two critical pieces of funding: start up money as well as general funding. The start-up money will be in the amount of \$25,000 which our district will use to transform the inside area of our preschool into an amazing learning environment with learning centers where students can experience a variety of engaging activities while they learn. The start up money will also help us address some of the outdoor materials that are age appropriate for students in preschool. We plan on addressing the playground as well in order to provide preschoolers with up to date facilities for our students outside. The general funding for the grant will be in the amount of \$130,000. That portion of funding will go directly to staffing the program with quality educators. We plan on having 1 certified teacher (hired on Monday) and 1 Paraprofessional to support up to 20 students.

At Leyton Public School, we take pride in our long history of academic excellence, dating back to 1978 when our school districts consolidated. We firmly believe that the addition of this preschool program will further enhance our track record of success, setting a strong foundation for the future of our students. Angie Borgmann will be the teacher for the Preschool and she is excited to get the program off and running in the best way possible for our students. Ms. Bormann has worked with preschoolers for many years and is excited to take on the challenge of preschool teacher for us. We realize that preschool teachers put in a ton of hours with our youngest children so it was important for us to get a curriculum and assessment component that will help lead our teacher and students to quality outcomes. We are purchasing Teaching Strategies as our curriculum for preschool. Mrs. Rathman has spent a lot of time and effort setting up a curriculum purchase that correlates to the early childhood assessments that the teacher will be completing throughout the year.

When it comes to our program goals, we intend to be the best place to raise a child in the state of Nebraska. With those lofty goals, it is going to be our expectation that our teacher is extremely familiar with the community and the families of our district. We will be holding community event nights, doing home visits for all families, setting and tracking goals throughout the year, and working with families to promote our program. When we surveyed our families, we found that there were at least 20 children who could enter our program next year. We want to fill that need and deliver a quality education. In order to do this we need the support of our community, if you know a child who needs preschool services, we need them to enroll.

Sustainability is the next most important step in our plan. If we have a need now, how can we keep a program going in year four when the grant is up? That's the big question, and an important question when adding any teacher position. We have to be able to sustain this program over time, so the decisions we make now will affect the future of our district moving into the future. The best way to sustain a program is to have a program at capacity. HeadStart will be partnering with us in the amount of around \$15,000 per year as long as we fill their slots in the preschool. There will be a sliding scale for attending the preschool as far as tuition goes. Our most recent discussions on tuition will be to set tuition at \$350 per month which figures to be around \$20 per day figuring 18 school days in the month. The cost for preschool for families on reduced lunch would then be \$175 per month and those on free lunch would be free or covered by HeadStart placement. We are excited about the opportunities that lie ahead and are grateful for the support of our community as we embark on this new chapter together. Together, we will ensure that every child at Leyton has the chance to thrive and succeed.



I'm looking forward to gaining even more background knowledge to share with students and I plan to bring back photos and souvenirs.




