School Closings and Late Starts Due to Weather/Road Conditions

In the event road or weather conditions make it necessary for the Leyton Public Schools to have a late start or cancel school for the day, the information will be broadcast on Sidney's KSID radio station and on Scottsbluff's KNEB radio station. These two stations have proven to be reliable and cooperative in relaying school closing information to the public.

KSID Radio (Sidney) is found at 98.7 FM and 1340 AM. KSID also posts school closing information on its website at ksidradio.com.

KNEB Radio (Scottsbluff) is found at 94.1 FM and 960 AM.

These stations will be called as soon as a decision is made regarding a late start/school cancellation. The information will generally be available by 6:30 am.

Occasionally a late start is changed to a cancellation when the weather and/or roads do not show the anticipated improvement. When a late start is announced, it is wise to stay tuned to KSID (or continue to check its website) or KNEB in the event the decision is made to close school entirely.

As always, families living in the rural areas of the Leyton district know the condition of the roads in their immediate area better than anyone. IF YOU DO NOT BELIEVE YOUR CHILDREN CAN GET SAFELY TO SCHOOL DUE TO WEATHER OR ROAD CONDITIONS, PLEASE KEEP THEM AT HOME AND NOTIFY THE SCHOOL THAT YOU ARE DOING SO.

Moved by Mr. Linton, seconded by Mrs. Cruise to approve the agenda. Motion approved 5-0.

REORGANIZATION OF THE BOARD:

Moved by Mr. Henke, seconded by Mr. Benish to reelect Jed Benish as President of the Board; Cary Linton as Vice-President of the Board; Jennifer Powell as Secretary of the Board and Colleen Cruise as Treasurer of the Board and to close nominations and cast a unanimous ballot for those individuals. Motion approved 5-0.

BUSINESS MEETING:

Moved by Mr. Henke, seconded by Mrs. Powell to approve General Fund bills and financial reports as presented. Motion approved 5-0.

Moved by Mr. Linton, seconded by Mrs. Cruise to approve bills and financial reports from the remaining funds as presented. Motion approved 5-0.

ACTION ITEMS:

Moved by Mrs. Powell, seconded by Mr. Henke to grant Special Recognition to all program participants for receiving the Veteran's Day Participation Award from Nebraska Secretary of State John Gale; to Mr. Oakes, Ms. Gipfert, Mrs. Melton, Mrs. Staudenmaler, and Mrs. Murray for outstanding Christmas programs at both sites; to the K-8th Spelling Bee Finalists (Mason Reimers – overall winner; Ethan Eckhardt, Alexandria Jeppson, Dominic Russ, Hannah Vath, and Rhonda Liddick); and to the Oregon Trail Honor Band participants (Abbe Draper, Kenny Ernest, & Jacob Frerichs). Motion approved 5-0.

Moved by Mr. Benish, seconded by Mr. Linton to approve an option enrollment request for a junior high school student. Motion approved 5-0.

Moved by Mr. Benish, seconded by Mr. Linton to accept, with regret, staff resignations from Mrs. Ginny Post (HS English Teacher); Mrs. Ann Hurt (JH/HS Art Teacher); and Mrs. Jennifer Gipfert (Asst. VB Coach) and to thank them for their years of service. Motion approved 5-0.

DISCUSION ITEMS (WITH POSSIBLE ACTION):

Discussed administrative evaluations and noted that the Superintendent should include a self-evaluation. The Superintendent's contract will be advertised and voted on at the February meeting.

Discussed the need for a new route bus with the suggestion to purchase another mini bus. The transportation committee will meet to review the District's current vehicles and to make recommendations.

REPORTS:

President Benish stated that he would like to see the School Report Card reinstated and inquired about the School Improvement Surveys. Member Cruise requested Board Retreat be held in February/March. The Board decided to hold it after the February meeting to give time for the committees to gather information.

Mr. Howitt reported on the December Senior Citizens Dinner; donations to the Needy Student fund; on the NSAA meeting (January 11th); the DC trip Fun Run (January 14th); MAC BB tournament (January 16th-21st) in Bridgeport; and football (Fall 2017).

Mr. Brenner reported on possible changes in federal legislation; suggested dates for next year's school calendar; and a teaching contract for Ms. Sue Kandel to teach 2nd semester college speech.

EXECUTIVE SESSION:

Entered into executive session with general consent at 7:25 p.m. to protect the reputation of the Superintendent. Returned to General Session at 7:50 p.m. by general consent.




