

**LEYTON PUBLIC SCHOOLS  
Board of Education Resolution**

Whereas, Leyton Public Schools is committed to providing an education of high quality to its students in an economically efficient manner; and

Whereas, the school district's facilities and equipment can serve only a limited number of students; and

Whereas, the Board of Education, in consultation with the administration, has examined the school district's facilities and equipment to determine the number of students it can serve in any given grade level;

Now, therefore, be it resolved that the Board of Education hereby declares that the capacity for each grade level in grades kindergarten through six is eighteen (18) students, the capacity for grade levels seven and eight is twenty (20) students, and the capacity for each grade level in grades nine through twelve is twenty-eight (28) students. The Board of Education will decline any request for option enrollment if granting the request would cause the district to exceed its capacity in any grade level.

Be it further resolved that the Board will have the following policy regarding intra-district transfers of elementary students and assignment of elementary option students:

- Students who live in elementary attendance areas other than the Gurley attendance center may transfer into the Gurley attendance center upon request.
- Students will not be allowed to transfer into any elementary attendance center other than the Gurley attendance center.
- All elementary students who option into the Leyton district will be assigned to the Gurley attendance center.

After the above resolution was read, Board Member Les Kuehn moved for passage of the resolution. Board member Lyle Borchert seconded the motion. After discussion, and on roll call vote, the following members voted in favor of the motion: Mr. Kuehn, Mr. Borchert, Mr. Rushman, Mr. Linton, Mr. Lojek

The following members voted against the motion: None

The following members did not vote: Mrs. Ernest (Absent)

Having been consented to by a majority of the voting members, the Board President declared the motion to have been passed and adopted.
