What is Title 1?

Title 1 is a Federal Grant that provides supplemental funding for resources to schools with a high concentration of students on free/reduced priced meals to meet educational goals, such as:

- → Smaller Class Setting
- → Additional Teachers and/or Paraprofessionals
- → Training for School Staff
- → Extra time for individualized or smaller group instruction
- → A variety of supplemental materials and equipment

Title 1 Parent and Family Engagement

- All Title 1 schools must allocate at least 1% of the Title 1 budget towards programs, activities, and procedures for parent and family engagement.
 - Leyton received \$22,817 for funds in 2021-2022 and \$27,938 for funds in 2022-2023.
 - These funds help cover salary, benefits, and supplies.
- The "Every Student Succeeds Act" (ESSA) requires that all Title 1 schools and families work together.
- Each school shall jointly develop with, and distribute to, parents and family members of participating children, a written Title 1 "Parents and Family Engagement Plan" (PFEP).



- ★ Assist parents in understanding academic content standards, assessments, and how to monitor and improve the achievement of their children through extended academic opportunities, such as tutoring and enrichment activities.

School-Parent Compact

- → Each Title 1 program must have a school-parent compact.
 - Developed by parents and school personnel



→ Sets out the responsibilities of the students, parents, and school staff to help with student achievement.

 Compact amendments should be discussed during PT conferences and documented in a communication log.

Parents' Right To Know

- Parents should be provided information regarding the level of achievement of their child on state required academic assessments.
- Information must be in a language that parents can understand.
- Request and receive timely information regarding the professional qualifications of their child's teachers.
- Parents must be notified if their child is assigned to or taught for four or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who is outside the field in which they are certified.
