CALL TO ORDER:

President Benish called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. Members present: Jed Benish, Kevin Henke, Jennifer Powell, and Rob Rushman. Members absent: Colleen Cruise and Cary Linton. Also present were Superintendent Chris Geary, High School Principal Lance Howitt, and Elementary/JH Principal Dana Morgan. In addition, there were five visitors.

Motion by Mr. Henke, seconded by Mrs. Powell to excuse Mrs. Cruise and Mr. Linton from this meeting. Motion carried 4-0.

AGENDA APPROVAL:

Motion by Mrs. Powell, seconded by Mr. Benish to approve the agenda. Motion carried 4-0.

SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS TO THE BOARD:

Mr. Cooper presented bids for IT equipment upgrade purchases and discussed the ag/shop program.

REPORTS:

Mr. Benish presented the Finance/Building & Grounds Committee report which included summer project updates and looking into the future with restoring the track for activity practices and events.

Mrs. Powell gave the Transportation Committee report which included changing bus routes and making recommendations to purchase a suburban and a car.

Mrs. Morgan presented the Elementary/JH Principal report on APL training and Administrator Days. She further discussed that her administrative certificate is now on file and that her and Mrs. Benish have finished setting up the libraries at both sites.

Mr. Howitt provided the HS Principal report which included his attendance at Administrator Days, APL Training, Western Nebraska Educators Conference, and the NSAA Caucus Committee Meeting.

Mr. Geary gave the Superintendent report which included meetings he attended with Dr. West, a New Superintendent Orientation, bus drivers, track coaches, an IEP, Ken Navratil (ALICAP), and interviews. He also attended the Western Nebraska Educators conference and Administrator Days. Mr. Geary gave updates on construction projects which included a handicap parking stall at Gurley, window installation and corresponding bookshelves at Dalton, new motion lights in the bathrooms and installation of the exterior doors in Dalton. Mr. Geary also gave recommendations for the actions items which included money transfers between funds, vehicle purchases, fence installation, vending machines, disposal of outdated computer equipment, water stations for the Elementary/JH, and the NASB membership meeting. He also stated that the APL training was fantastic and that the Saxon Math training and Open House are scheduled for tomorrow (August 14th).

Motion by Mr. Rushman, seconded by Mrs. Powell to approve the Consent Agenda which includes the minutes of the July 9, 2018 Regular School Board Meeting, approval of the

Superintendent as the official representative of the District and to sign all state and federal forms, authorization for the Superintendent to pay appropriate bills through August 31, 2018 to conclude the 2017-2018 fiscal year, approval to include the Asthma/Anaphylaxis protocol in all handbooks, and to approve all reports. Motion carried 4-0.

REGULAR AGENDA:

Motion by Mr. Henke, seconded by Mr. Rushman to recognize Jessica Pelster for the use of her classroom for APL training, to Mark Carley for helping set up for APL training, to Nick Newkirk for the use of his classroom for Saxon Math training, to Allie Peters for her Open House ideas, to all of our students who competed during 4-H, summer swimming, and baseball and for their many achievements, to Jonathan Borges and KJ Bush for qualifying for the State JH Track Meet, to all staff members who have worked all summer to get projects done to start the new school year, to the coaches for providing summer opportunities for their athletes such as weight room, camps, and summer league, to Dexter Goodner for working two days with the girls' basketball program, and to John Schwaderer and Cabela's for donating I-pads to our school. Motion carried 4-0.

Motion by Mrs. Powell, seconded by Mr. Rushman to approve General Fund bills and Financial Reports as presented. Motion carried 4-0.

Motion by Mr. Henke, seconded by Mrs. Powell to approve bills and financial reports from the remaining funds as presented. Motion carried 4-0.

Motion by Mr. Rushman, seconded by Mr. Henke to approve the transfers of \$150,000 from the General Fund to the Depreciation Fund, and \$25,000 from the General Fund to the Activity Fund, and \$10,000 from the General Fund to the Lunch Fund. Motion carried 4-0.

Motion by Mr. Henke, seconded by Mr. Rushman to approve the bid from Panhandle Auto in the amount of \$42,645 to purchase a school suburban. Motion carried 4-0.

Motion by Mrs. Powell, seconded by Mr. Henke to approve the bid from Panhandle Auto in the amount of \$22,353.24 to purchase a school car. Motion carried 4-0.

Motion by Mr. Rushman, seconded by Mr. Henke to approve the bid from Travis Sparks in the amount \$18,165.00 to install a 6' chain link fence at the Gurley site playground. Motion failed 0-4.

The Spring scores are submitted to the State Department of Education and the results are used in the District's Report Card. You can find previous years' Report Cards at <http://nep.education.ne.gov/Districts/Index/17-0003-000?DataYears=20172018>. 4th and 8th graders will also take the NSCAS (Nebraska Student Centered Assessment System) tests in the Spring. I am eager to see how the changes we implement within our curriculum and instructional model will positively impact these data. Our commitment is to unprecedented student success. We'll be gathering data all year long to evaluate our progress.

BACK TO SCHOOL REMINDERS FROM LEYTON HIGH SCHOOL & MR. HOWITT

SCHOOL HOURS & SCHOOL DAY

School hours are from 8:00 A.M. to 3:20 P.M. at the Dalton site. The high school breakfast period is from 8:50 A.M. to 9:00 A.M. The addition of this ten minute period at the high school has been well received and students are definitely taking advantage of their opportunity to have time to fuel up for their day. Vending machines will be available in the near future to give students another option for a healthy snack during their morning break.

SCHOOL VISITATION

Visitors are always welcome in our school. We ask, however, that they sign-in at the main office and wear a visitors badge for the duration of their visit. Visitors will need to sign out in the main office at the conclusion of their visit. Please confirm with the classroom teacher the date & time prior to your visit and limit the length of your visit to two hours.

FOBS

All community FOBS will be shut off on August 31. Applications may be renewed or obtained from the Dalton office. The safety and security of Leyton Public School students is and will remain the number one priority of Leyton Public Schools. For the administration and staff at Leyton Public, school security is something we take very serious and is a daily priority. A law enforcement officer I heard speak this summer summed it up best when he said "our focus isn't keeping the kids inside, it is keeping the dangers of the world outside."

Key FOB Security Reminders

Key fobs present unique and special circumstances for members of the community to use the weight room, gym and facilities including the restrooms. **The use of the FOB is a privilege and can and will be suspended if the terms of the key fob agreement are violated.**

Therefore, the following reminders are for key FOB users concerning their access into the building:

- ★ Key fob holders must be 19 years of age and a resident of the Leyton School District
- ★ Student use is strictly prohibited without parental supervision
- ★ Equipment (weights, tarps, nets, tables, chairs, etc) may not be moved to accommodate key fob users.
- ★ Use of the sound equipment in the gym is strictly prohibited
- ★ Lights left on and unlocked doors are the responsibility of the key fob holder, charges may apply
- ★ Key fob holders with unsupervised students in the building are prohibited
- ★ Key fob holders are responsible for their own fob key and are not to loan it out to anyone else
- ★ Key fob holders are not allowed to bring guests into the building. (example: outside club teams with a facilities use agreement, town teams, family reunions, etc.) Each adult needs to have a signed waiver form on file and pay the yearly fee in order to use the facilities

The failure to comply with any one (or more) of the parameters will result in disabling the key fob for that individual and forfeiture of the key fob fee.

Notes from the Nurse

As we are kicking off the new school year, I wanted to remind you all of some required health related information.

Immunizations:

NEBRASKA STATE LAW requires ALL students entering Kindergarten to be immunized BEFORE school entrance, and 1 dose of Tdap for those students entering 7th grade.

For those who are entering Kindergarten:

- Tetanus-diphtheria (DTaP, DTP, DT or Td) - 3 doses, one given after the 4th birthday.
- Polio - 3 doses needed.
- Hepatitis B series - all 3 doses of the series needed.
- Measles (MMR or MMRV) - 2 doses to be given on or after 12 months of age, and separated by at least one month.
- Varicella (chickenpox) - 2 doses to be given on or after 12 months of age or Documentation of having the disease

For those entering 7th grade:

- A tetanus-diphtheria-pertussis (Tdap) booster is needed.

Did you know...

You can view and print your child's immunization records in the NESIIS system (Nebraska State Immunization Information System) at <http://www.dhhs.ne.gov/nesiis>

- From the home page, scroll down to the big "ENTER" button.
- This will take you to another screen where you will enter your child's name, birthdate and SS#.
- Click "search" and your child's immunization records will appear on the screen.
- From here, you can view and print your child's immunizations.

NESIIS electronically stores a child's immunization record in a secure system. You and your Health Care providers can access the information to determine which, if any, immunizations are needed at any given time. Complete and up-to-date immunization records can be printed for yourself, schools, daycares, or whenever you need them.

I have also updated the **school required** immunizations in goedustar. If you need access to goedustar, please contact Kathy Surber at the elementary site at 308-884-2247. At the high school contact Janella Kruse or Liz Twarling at 308-377-2301. They would be happy to help!

Physicals: Only the Leyton approved form will be accepted.

A physical examination by a physician, physician assistant (PA), or advanced practice registered nurse (APRN) is required within six months prior to Kindergarten and the 7th grade. A physical is also required if a student transfers to our school from out of state, and for all students participating in sports during the school year. **Please be sure your provider and you as the parent or guardian sign the form.**

Vision Exam: Only the Leyton approved form will be accepted.

A visual exam by a physician, physician assistant (PA), advanced practice registered nurse (APRN) or an optometrist is required within six months prior to Kindergarten, or if a student transfers to our school from out of state.

Dental Exam: Only the Leyton approved form will be accepted.

This year we are requiring all incoming Kindergarten students to have a dental screening. This can be done by your dentist or dental hygienist.

Health History Form: Only the Leyton approved form will be accepted.

This will help me relay pertinent information to staff members and determine whether your student needs special accommodations for any health related conditions.

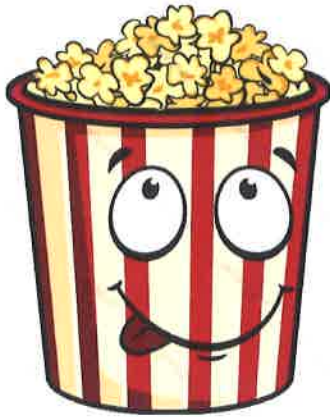
