A Message from the Superintendent:

Hello again. This is the month of Thanksgiving, and I want to begin this month's message with a big "Thank You" to all of our parents and community volunteers. Grandma Annie serves our district with such enthusiasm and dedication. Parents give countless hours and unlimited resources to support our students. What we do wouldn't be possible without you. Thanks...again...and Happy Thanksgiving everyone.

The district conducted a Lockdown and Evacuation drill last month. All students and staff were escorted out of their buildings to our evacuation sites by law enforcement. The Cheyenne County Sheriff's department assisted with the drill. The drill was successful and communication and routines were effective. We hope that we never have to use these procedures, but it is comforting to know that our kids and staff know how to be safe in the event of an emergency.

Our students took the fall MAP (Measure of Academic Progress) test and the results are in. We definitely have some work to do. These scores are used, among other things, to measure "proficiency." Proficiency is defined as scoring above the 50th Percentile – or better than half of the students who have taken the same assessment. In math, 69% of Leyton students scored proficient or higher; Reading, 62%; Language Usage, 61%; and, Science, 66%. We understand that these results are not acceptable. We are working to improve our instruction and outcomes. We can do better...and we will. I'll keep you informed of our progress.

We will begin a Sidney bus route on November 5. We will be picking up students at WNCC's Here We Grow Preschool and Daycare. The bus will leave Sidney at 7:10 AM Sharp. Please let Kathy know if your children will be riding the Sidney bus. We hope this better serves our school families.

I would like to start an "Adopt-a-Flowerbed" at both sites. I know there are people in the community who would like to show their school pride by taking care of a few flowers at school. Please contact the school if you'd like to volunteer.

Finally, I want to update all of you on the new track which is scheduled to be finished by the time school starts in August 2019. The board approved this project at a special meeting held October 22 in Gurley. We were eager to hear from approximately 40 district patrons regarding this project. We are investing in our community and are excited for the benefits this project will bring for our students and members of the community.  - 4.4.1 Mrs. Morgan reported that the elementary/junior high has started a new character counts program, that MAP testing and DIBELS testing are complete, that the book fair will run from October 12th-19th, and that she visited Ms. Barb Edwards, Principal at Crawford, to learn about student MAP data folders.
 - 4.5 SECONDARY PRINCIPAL’S REPORT

4.5.1 Mr. Howitt reported that MAP testing is complete, that Michelle Keszler, from the ESU, will work with staff on MAP testing data on October 15th, that the lockdown drill with law enforcement evacuation will be on October 11th, and that Homecoming Week starts October 15th.

4.6 SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

4.6.1 Meetings/Travel

4.6.1.1 Mr. Geary spoke with a handful of patrons at The Dock and the Homestead Market for the Superintendent Scoop. He also attended the NCSA School Law Update in Kearney. He met with the principals to review our evaluation documents and process. He also met with Ken Navratil, our ALICAP representative, and conducted safety walkthroughs of both campuses.

4.6.2 Construction Updates

4.6.2.1 Mr. Geary reported that the District has received the Suburban and is still waiting on the Impala. He also met with the Building and Grounds Committee and Ryan Stearns, an architect with Hewgley and Associates, regarding the track. He also expressed the need for a wall between the DL room and Mrs. Schumacher's room due to noise distractions.

4.6.3 Action Items

4.6.3.1 Mr. Geary had a student inquire about early graduation and recommended that the Board adopt Policy #5066. He also mentioned that overnight stays may be necessary for District Volleyball, State Volleyball, and FFA State Land Judging.

4.6.4 Other Items

4.6.4.1 Our October 1, 2018 enrollment was 158 students: K-10; 1st-4; 2nd-11; 3rd-11; 4th-9; 5th-11; 6th-12; 7th-16; 8th-20; 9th-15; 10th-12; 11th-16; 12th-11. We have 36 student opting into our district and 26 optioning out.

4.6.4.2 Seven affirmative surveys were received for the Sidney bus route representing almost a dozen students.

NOVEMBER NEWSLETTER FROM LEYTON HIGH SCHOOL & MR. HOWITT

Vaping/Juuling/E-cigarettes have become a hot topic for school principals. According to the Leyton High School activities handbook, Vaping/Juuling/E-cigarettes are considered tobacco and any students that possess or uses tobacco in any form will be subject to school and activities discipline. Any students that is involved in clubs and activities that uses any form of tobacco at any time will be deemed ineligible per activities guideline. Parents and Guardians please talk to your students about the dangers of this activity.

What is Vaping and JUULing?

Vaping, also known as JUULing, is becoming more popular with youth in middle school and high school. Vaping means using an electronic cigarette (e-cigarette) or other vaping device. It is referred to as vaping because tiny puffs or clouds of vapor are produced when using the devices. E-cigarettes are battery powered and deliver nicotine through a liquid (called e-juice), which turns into a vapor when using the devices. The liquid comes in flavors, such as mint, fruit, and bubble gum, which appeal to kids. Youth often believe that the liquid used in vaping only contains water and flavoring and are unaware that it contains nicotine. Therefore, they may think vaping is less dangerous than using other tobacco products, such as cigarettes. The amount of nicotine in the liquid can be the same or even more than the amount found in cigarettes. Nicotine is very addictive and can harm children and teens' developing brains. Using nicotine can cause problems with learning and attention and can lead to addiction. Many types of e-cigarettes are available, but one popular brand is JUUL. JUUL is becoming more prevalent with youth in middle and high school because of its small size, and it looks like a USB device. When using a JUUL it is often referred to as JUULing.

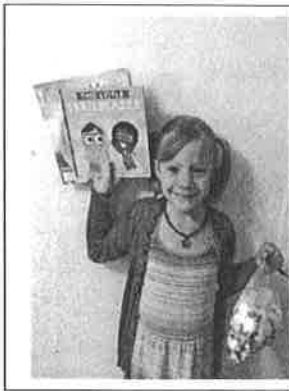
