

LEYTON BOARD OF EDUCATION, DISTRICT 17-0003 BOARD OF EDUCATION MINUTES February 11, 2019 – 6:30 PM

The Leyton Board of Education met Monday, February 11, 2019 at 6:30 P.M. in the District's Administrative Office. Publicized notice of the meeting was posted in the Leyton High School, Leyton JH/Elementary School, and on the www.leytonwarriors.org website on or before February 5, 2019. Said posting gave date, time, and location of the meeting.

1 CALL TO ORDER

- 1.1 Board Vice President Kevin Henke called the regular school board meeting to order at 6:30 P.M.
- 1.2 ROLL CALL
 - 1.2.1 The following Board of Education members were present: Galen Bartling, Ryan Borges, Colleen Cruise, Kevin Henke, and Anne Rexroth. Absent: Jed Benish
 - 1.2.2 The following Administrators were present: Superintendent Chris Geary and HS Principal Lance Howitt. Absent: Elementary/JH Principal Dana Morgan.
- 1.3 APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Motion by Rexroth, seconded by Borges to approve the agenda. ROLL CALL VOTE: VOTING YES – Borges, Henke, Rexroth, Cruise and Bartling. VOTING NO – None. MOTION CARRIED: 5-0.

1.4 COMMUNICATIONS

Communications were read from Dot Hall.

2 HEARINGS AND PERSONS TO ADDRESS THE BOARD

- 3 SPECIAL PRESENTATIONS TO THE BOARD
 - 3.1 FFA Student, Kelcie Van Anne, thanked the Board for providing transportation and approving their Stock Show trip to Denver. They visited many booths, attended several shows and enjoyed the rodeo.
- 4 REPORTS
 - 4.1 STUDENT BOARD MEMBERS REPORT

On behalf of the Student Council, Mr. Howitt reported that they are planning Powder Puff and co-ed games for the week of February 25th. They are also looking into hosting a Game Night between the basketball and track seasons.

- 4.2 BOARD REPORTS
 - 4.2.1 The Security/Crisis Team met on January 28, 2019 with fifteen members present. The committee discussed the lockdown drills/evacuations that were completed during the fall semester, the school hazard plan, and how to handle bomb threats. They also talked about the Safety and Security Standards and the Standard Response Protocol. The Team ended the meeting with a general questions session and updated contact information for new members.
- 4.3 STAFF MEMBERS REPORT

None

- 4.4 ELEMENTARY/JH PRINCIPAL'S REPORT
 - Mr. Geary presented the Elementary/JH Principal's report because Mrs. Morgan was serving on the Mitchell Elementary AdvancEd External Review Team. Mrs. Morgan attended three IEP meetings in January, observed two teacher evaluations, sat in on numerous parent/teacher conferences, compiled honor rolls for grades 3-12, and created a new "Spotlight on Staff" section for the newsletter. In addition, she attended the third grade performance and completed Eleot 2.0 training for certification and AdvancEd training. The Elementary/JH also hosted a spelling bee and a geography bee.
- 4.5 SECONDARY PRINCIPAL'S REPORT
 - Mr. Howitt presented winter MAP data for grades 9, 10, and 11. He reported that the HS had a 42.3% attendance rate for parent-teacher conferences which is about average for second

semester. He stated that staff attended Mr. Geary's Data Professional Development on February 4th and will go to Chadron on February 18th for a Dr. John Antonetti presentation. The HS wrestlers completed their first season at Districts on February 8th-9th. Mr. Howitt reported that Leyton hosted the JH MAC Basketball Tournament at both sites on February 8th & 9th and that MAC Speech will be at South Platte on February 20th. He also ordered new state qualifying activity banners which will be displayed in the gym.

4.6 SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

4.6.1 Meetings/Travel

4.6.1.1 Mr. Geary attended the Western Nebraska Administrators' and the Security/Crisis Committee meetings. He met with two architects to look at the science room and provide input for updating that space. He also attended an AdvancEd In-Person-Session training and learned valuable insights into the accreditation process. Mr. Geary also asked the Board to consider a later meeting date in March (March 13th at 4:30 p.m.) due to Spring Break the week prior. He also reported that the teachers were fantastic in learning data collections and student achievement information which was presented at the professional development meeting.

4.6.2 Construction Updates

4.6.2.1 Mr. Geary and the Building/Grounds Committee met to confirm the design of the track and restroom facility and approved the bid documents. They will begin the bidding process and bring specific pricing options and contracts for approval at the March meeting. A date will be set to open and review the bids. The architects who looked at the science room will be presenting their ideas for renovation soon.

4.6.3 Action Items

4.6.3.1 Mr. Geary stated that Leyton will host the MAC Quiz Bowl on March 19th. He asked the Board to consider a 12:30 P.M. early dismissal on that date as all staff will be needed to help with this event. He discussed a student request for early graduation, excess property to be sold on the Gurley Lions Club sale, a teacher resignation, and a FFA overnight stay at Leadership Conference. He informed the Board that AMERESCO, an energy savings company, would like to do a no cost energy audit in our district. Mr. Geary also reported on new members for the Leyton Foundation and a policy on student board members.

4.6.4 Other Items

4.6.4.1 Mr. Geary reported that the senior class has planned their trip for this year and that he has agreed to the bus and driver requests, if necessary. He added the requirement that students who have missed more than 20 days are not eligible to attend the senior trip.

A Message from the Superintendent

Are you as tired of the cold as I am? I'm dreaming of summer sun, warm evenings of golf, and an end to this torturous cold! Unfortunately, according to the Farmers' Almanac, it seems like Old Man Winter will test our patience for quite a few more weeks – despite Punxsutawney Phil's prediction.

Planning is the theme for this month. In school, like life, we make plans with the best information we can gather. The administration and Board have invested a number of hours considering how to best serve the students and families or our district. The Board has scheduled a Strategic Planning meeting from noon to 4 p.m. on Wednesday, March 13, 2019 at Points West Bank. You are welcome to come. One item on the agenda is our district Mission, Vision, and Goals. Currently our mission statement says we:

"Cultivate life-long learners as they successfully transition into our diverse world."

Our vision is:

"Unprecedented Success, Unparalleled Joy."

These ideas inform our goals, both in the classroom and in our activities. This open meeting will be used to identify goals for the upcoming school year. If you have any ideas, please share them with our Board. We'll be discussing everything from academics to facilities, from personnel to curriculum, and everything in between. This meeting will inform our Continuous Improvement Plan, give us direction, and prioritize financial allocations for the upcoming school year, and years to come. The regular March meeting will follow at 4:30 p.m. in the Board Room in the high school in Dalton.

One important date on the near horizon is March 19, 2019. Leyton will be hosting our conference Quiz Bowl on that day. Consequently, school will be dismissed at 12:30 p.m. Busses will run accordingly. Please be prepared for your students to be home early that day if they aren't involved in Quiz Bowl.

Finally, we are considering how to best implement a few new ideas for the next school year while more efficiently using days where a high percentage of our students are absent. Activities often take a large percentage of students out of school – in the high school at Leyton we lose 40% or more of our students on one day of the school week at least half of the year. The question we are trying to answer is: What is the best academic investment we can make during days when we have a large number of absences? A similar question is: What is the formal process we have at Leyton to connect students and adults to foster stronger relationships and career planning? Some schools use a "homeroom" class. Others use special class times. Is there an option for us? If you have any ideas about these questions or similar ones, I would love to hear from you! SUPERVISION, SUPERVISION, SUPERVISION

Teachers and administrators in eastern Nebraska have recently been in the news over some sticky legal matters. I dislike using the misfortune of others for a newsletter topic but we have reached the time of the school year to rededicate ourselves to stay vigilant to issues like supervision.

Our focus at the high school has been to have staff present while our students are using the locker rooms. I know that Leyton students will adjust to our increase in locker room supervision and realize it is for their own safety. Legally we have an obligation to keep your children safe when under our supervision. Prior to coming to Leyton, I was involved in an incident where improper filming was done in a locker room. This incident was done by team member of a neighboring school using our locker room during a basketball tournament. I have been in Leyton for four years and I recently received a notice that the proceedings in the court case have just finally been settled. Four years of a young life wasted by making a very poor choice. These cases are tragic reminders of what can happen when supervision is neglected. I know people think that these situations could never happen in a small, rural district such as Leyton but our approach is to be ever vigilant in regards to student safety.

Mr. Geary and our school attorneys, KSB School Law in Lincoln, have been gracious enough to provide me with access to several articles dealing with cases when schools have failed to provide adequate legal supervisions. Please contact me if you are interested in reading about the cases provided to us from KSB and I will gladly share the links with you.





My favorite sports teams are the Huskers (football & volleyball), Denver Broncos, Warriors, and Bulldogs. I love coaching and watching my own children play.


4. What do you like to do in your downtime?





2019 Rules and Regulations

Team Rosters

- 1. Players must play with players that were in high school while you were also in high school. All players must be from Leyton High School, except for one outside player per every 4 alumni you have on the team.
- 2. All teams should wear similar jerseys/shirts during the tournament. Basketball shoes or clean tennis shoes must be worn for all games.
- 3. All team coaches are entirely responsible to make sure that their players fully understand and follow tournament rules and regulations.
- 4. All participants must have signed the waiver/liability form on the official roster sheet prior to the first game played. This will be available the day of the event.

Entry Fee

- 1. The entry fee is \$20 per player. Checks should be made out to the Leyton Public School Foundation.
- 2. Entry Fee can be paid the day of the event.

Playing Rules

- 1. Game Clock: Games consist of two 20 minute halves. The clock will run, except for the last 2 minutes of both halves. If a team is ahead by more than 15 points at anytime during the last 2 minutes, the clock will run.
- 2. Overtime: All overtimes will consist of three minute periods with clock stopping with fouls and violations in the last one minute.
- 3. Time Outs: Each team will be given 2 time outs (1 minute) per half and they will not carry over. In case of overtime, 1 extra time out will be given.
- 4. Team Fouls: Players will be given 5 fouls per game. Bonus shots will be given after the 7th team foul and the team will be in double bonus after the 10th team foul, per half.

- 5. Technical Fouls: All technical fouls will account for a personal foul. A player who receives a technical foul must sit out of the game for three minutes off the game clock before he/she will be allowed back into the game. If a player receives a second technical foul during the same game the player will be ejected from the tournament.
- 6. 3-Pointers: High School 3-point line will be utilized in all games.
- 7. Pressing: Full Court pressing is allowed.

Conduct

- 1. All participants; coaches and spectators shall refrain from using profanity or verbal abuse towards other players, coaches, spectators, referees, and tournament staff.
- 2. Team coaches will be responsible for the conduct of their players. Teams and spectators shall abide by tournament rules and regulations.
- 3. The Tournament Director and Staff are not responsible for any personal items left behind, lost, or stolen.

Fighting

1. Fighting is an attempt to strike an opponent with arms, hands, legs, feet, or combative action by one or more players, a coach, or other team personnel. Any member or team personnel who participate in a fight shall be immediately suspended from the game for the duration of the game and possible for future games to be determined by tournament director.

Legacy Game - NEW THIS YEAR

This will be a game for any one 35 and older right before the championship game for anyone who wants to play but not be competitive. It will still be \$20 per person and teams will be created the day of the event with a maroon and gold team. The purpose of the game is to allow an older group a better suited chance to play without injury and is expect to be great entertainment for the crowd.


