

He also attended the John Antonetti presentation. He stated that the Career Exploration event for the Freshmen/Sophomores was cancelled due to the storm. Mr. Howitt presented a golf team cost analysis for the Board to review as well as listing other key points to consider in establishing this program.

A Message from the Superintendent

This month I'd like to focus on planning. Summarizing the ideas and words of Benjamin Franklin and Winston Churchill, my dad's admonition to me was, "Nobody plans to fail, but you will - if you fail to plan." Successful organizations always have a plan; and some plans are better than others. Schools are no different. The Board and I spent some time before the March meeting beginning our planning for the next school year. We discussed budgeting, scheduling, assessment, and student success. We considered our district's vision and mission and how we can best reach our goals. Here are some data points we examined:

- 1. When combining state aid and local property taxes over the past ten years, there has been almost no increase: 2009/2010 \$3,302,201; 2018/2019 \$3,374.075. That's just over two-tenths of a percent average annual growth. In fact, compared to last year, that number decreased \$16,396. While there have been minor fluctuations, taxes over the past ten years have been very stable. The Board has set a very conservative goal of 1% annual growth.
- 2. Teacher's base salary over that same time period has increased more than 1.7% annually. The base salary for next year (2019-2020) has increased almost six percent! That does not include the cost of insurance which rose more than five percent for the next school year.
- 3. In the fall of 2018, less than 70% of Leyton students were proficient in every content area. The board has set a goal of 80% proficient.
- 4. The AdvancED school accreditation report indicated a need for teachers to have common time for planning and professional development as an improvement priority.
- 5. Our student-teacher ratio is 7:1.
- 6. The highest Average Daily Membership for our district in the past ten years is 214 students. We are currently serving 157 students. Our goal is 200 students. Our option enrollment has decreased significantly over that time period as well. This year we are +10 which means students coming to our district outnumbered those leaving by ten.

We are formulating plans for the next year to address each of these areas. We are focused on being fiscally responsible while providing necessary services to our students. We are committed to increasing student success by providing quality instruction in tandem with a strong curriculum aligned to state standards. We believe that it is important to value those who serve our students and commit to a compensation package that supports that belief. We will implement strategies that allow teachers to collaborate for the benefit of our students. We will increase visibility and highlight the amazing things happening in our District to attract new students and families. In short, we will be better.

Do you have ideas for improvement? I welcome your insights. My door is always open. If you prefer, we can meet in Dalton or Gurley, at the bank, at the Market, or at the Dock. Just call Janella and schedule a time. Or just stop in if you're close by. Having strong community involvement in our school will make it stronger. I look forward to hearing from you.


Board Approves Contract to Renovate Track

At the March 2019, Regular Meeting of the Board of Education, members voted to renovate the track at Leyton. Construction will begin as soon as possible. Many of you may not have seen the track recently, so I've included a picture of our track taken March 19, 2019. Track practice began February 25. To date, our student-athletes have not been able to practice on our track – and the forecast doesn't look like they'll be able to use it any time soon! Thank you to Sidney Public Schools for hosting our athletes for practice – we've been able to take our students to practice once this season. While this is not an ideal situation for our district, we are grateful for their willingness to host us.

There are a few items I would like to remind our stakeholders about this project. First, the idea for installing an all-weather track is not new. Patrons and the Board have asked previous administration about the possibility of this project for a number of years. At the Regular Board meeting in August 2018, the Building and Grounds committee reported that they had discussed the feasibility of a new track. Consequently, I was asked if funds were available for this size of a project. After researching our budget history and considering our fund balances, I informed the Board that funds were available. In October the Board discussed more formally the possibility of this project becoming reality. They scheduled a board workshop to gain community input and held that meeting on October 22, 2018. More than 40 people attended this meeting and most expressed strong support for this project at an estimated cost of \$990,000. Later that evening, the Board approved the drafting of a contract with the architect to design the track. On November 6, the Building and Grounds committee met with the architect to discuss the plans and provide input on the design. At that time the committee recommended adding an additional building for restrooms and a concession stand. Preliminary sketches were presented at the December 2018, Regular Board meeting and a contract to design the track by JR Hewgley and Assoc. was approved. The design of the track and concessions building was put out for bid in late February and sealed bids were opened March 4. Initial bids for both components (track and concession building) totaled more than \$1.8 million dollars almost twice what was initially estimated. The board made the responsible decision to eliminate the building from the project and alter the base of the track from concrete to asphalt along with some other minor deletions. The resulting project cost was approved at LESS THAN the original estimate - not to exceed \$987,773.66. Please note that Wheat Belt PPD had previously cautioned the district that football lighting was unsafe and should be replaced. New lighting (a cost of more than \$200,000) will be installed as part of this project, and is included in the overall bid. These are funds which would have had to be spent even if a track was not installed. Funds for this project will be from the Depreciation and Building Fund – and will not require additional tax asking – and plans are in place to invest in upgrades for our high school science room and locker rooms. Neither of these projects will be compromised as a result of the track.

You may be wondering why this project is important. First, and most pressing, is that our track is not usable – as you can tell by the picture. Second, this project provides a significant return on investment. Not only will this facility be available for our students, but our community will also benefit from using this all-weather surface. This facility will not only be used during track season. PE classes will also have a safe place for outdoor activities. Finally, we will begin hosting track meets. Instead of us driving to other schools, visitors will bring their teams to our town for competition – and support our local businesses. Our first home track meets will happen in the Spring of 2020!

If you have any questions about this project, please feel free to stop in for a visit. I would love to talk to you. At the Board Retreat held March 18, our discussion centered on the commitment to improve. This project is one piece of that commitment. Our student-athletes are grateful for your support. We look forward to seeing you at the track next year!



SPRING TIME=ASSESSMENT TIME

Teachers and students in Nebraska know that Spring means that it is time for various types of assessments. In Nebraska, students take MAP, NSCAS, and ACT tests each Spring to monitor their growth and progress over the school year. Testing season can be an stressful time of the year but there are some simple steps that can help to eliminate test anxiety for your students.

- 1. Get plenty of rest. Well-rested students perform better on tests.
- 2. Keep your normal routine.
- 3. Attendance on test days. Unless it is an emergency, get your kids to school on testing days. Making up tests outside of their peer group can be stressful for students.
- 4. Whether at home or at school, eat a good breakfast.
- 5. Discuss with your students what they learned from the tests and what they have learned during the school year. It will help them measure progress.

No matter which side of the testing issue you are on, standardized testing has become commonplace and it is most likely here to stay. Hopefully these simple suggestions will make the testing season much more manageable in your household this year and in the future.


4. What do you like to do in your downtime?


