

President Suzy Ernest called the regular school board meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The public was informed of the Open Meetings Act posted on the wall of the multi-purpose room. Publicized notice of the meeting was posted in the Sidney Sun-Telegraph, Leyton High School, Leyton Elementary/JH, at various businesses in the community, and on the www.leytonwarriors.org website on or before Wednesday, April 7, 2021. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Rol Rushman, Secretary Leyton Board of Education This is my first report that does not mention the reason for delays caused by snow storms. That's a good thing. The moisture is sure to help the farmers and now spring activities can go full force. At this writing it is a great day outside. Hopefully all of our students involved in outdoor activities can benefit from the warm, sunny days.

As the end of school approaches and activities begin to slow it becomes time to shift our thoughts toward next year. With that in mind there are several activities taking place that you should be aware of. The COVID pandemic has had many detrimental effects on the district. However, there has been one benefit. The Federal government has a grant allowing us to spend some funds on projects in the district to help eliminate the threat of COVID affecting the district again. With that in mind, we have asked for help in improving our HVAC systems in the science room and the industrial tech shop. Social distancing is an area we feel can be used to help our kids. Spacing work areas at greater distances in the science room and industrial tech area is another section of the grant we hope to take advantage of and provide improved places for them to work. Replacing some of the current fluorescent lighting with LED lighting will provide a more relaxing environment and thus reduce stress among the students. It is hoped all of the goals developed for this grant will benefit our students and make school a great place to learn.

At the time the newsletter was put together our staff for next year will have been put in place and work has begun with the new members so they will be ready to go when school starts. Statistics indicate there has been an unusual amount of movement in the education field. Reports are that the COVID problem has prompted many teachers to either take early retirement or work in another field. That has caused more vacancies than normal. Therefore, more young teachers have been able to move to other districts. Many districts are experiencing large numbers of vacancies and many have resorted to offering bonuses for new staff members. It is great that the nucleus of our staff has remained in place.

The fact that the majority of our sponsors and coaches for extracurricular activities are returning is another bonus. This is the time of the year coaches normally develop plans for activities throughout the summer. Our kids are really busy with camps, work nights and leagues. All positions should be filled by Board meeting time so the participants can plan their summer.

Along with keeping the students busy during the summer our attention has also turned to our grounds keeping tasks for the district. Our fields need a lot attention. Several of our current patrons and even past students have provided a ton of advice and time toward helping us improve these areas. For example, FFA students have volunteered to do upgrades on the flower beds around the high school and patrons have volunteered to do the same at the junior high/elementary. All this just reinforces how great small communities are for pitching in and getting things done. Thanks.



The power of Positive Attention

What is positive attention?

Positive attention requires a lens shift in which we call out kids for good behavior and ignore (in the moment) the not-so-good. The idea is that for children, parental attention is so powerful that whatever behavior we pay attention to will increase, even if we're telling them to stop. Essentially, rather than chiding them for what they're doing wrong we want to catch kids doing right.

How to?

Try to spell out exactly what they are doing well. For example, you could say "I love how you are sharing your crayons with your sibling" or "it's awesome that you finished your homework before asking to use your tablet." No matter their age, letting kids know that you appreciate their behavior will make them feel good, and when they know exactly what they are being praised for they will be more likely to do it again in the future.

What about bad behavior?
If your child is in danger, intervene.
Otherwise, ignore and provide positive attention when they stop. You are sending the message that acting out is not the way for them to get what they want. Later, when things have calmed down, you can circle back around to talk about it.

What has your child been exploring in quidance class?

The <u>Attitude of Gratitude</u> mindset. These 4 elements help teach us the importance of seeking the positives from life experiences and being thankful for all that we have.

- 1. Treasure Yourself
- 2. Be More Grateful
- 3. Thank It Forward
- 4. Elevate Your Perspective

5 Dos and Don'ts to support the Attitude of Gratitude mindset at home.

- DO practice gratitude every day. This could be a family journal or verbalizing all the big and small things.
- **2. Do** model saying "thank you" regularly.
- 3. Don't let the bad times be all bad, believe they help us learn something useful.
- **4. Do** let your children know what you appreciate about them.
- Do treasure yourself and take care of yourself as a role model for your child.


