REPORTS:

Dear Leyton Families,

Congratulations to our Junior High Basketball teams on a very successful season. Both teams were very exciting to watch and there were several great moments/highlights throughout their seasons. The boys ended their season with a 2nd place finish at the MAC tournament and the girls placed 4th at the MAC tournament.

Congratulations to the High School wrestling team for a successful completion to their season. Leyton had three wrestlers compete at the district tournament at Bridgeport High School. Trenton Rushman and Dawson Juelfs were one win away from qualifying for the state meet and Brenton Abbott placed 4th which qualified him for the State Wrestling Tournament. Brenton was one of sixteen wrestlers at his weight class to qualify for the state meet and he finished with two wins and two losses.

Girls basketball finished the year at 11-11, losing to South Platte in the sub-district championship. Boys are currently in the sub-district championship with hopefully a strong chance to make the state tournament, let's wish them luck.

On Fridays of next year I'm proposing a 2:00 p.m. dismissal for students who are passing their classes. I believe that this is a great incentive for students and an opportunity for Principals to work with staff. Only students K-12 will be leaving early on Fridays, as teachers and other staff will work on Professional Learning Communities, Multi-Tiered Systems of Support, Positive Behavioral Interventions, and much more.

Spring is a busy time in our classrooms for testing. The testing window for NSCAS (Nebraska Student-Centered Assessment System), which is the Nebraska statewide assessment system tests students in grades 3-8 is March 21st through May 6th. 
