**CALL TO ORDER:**

President Ryan Borges called the regular school board meeting to order at 7:01 p.m. The public was informed of the Open Meetings Act posted on the wall of the multi-purpose room. Publicized notice of the meeting was posted in the Sidney Sun-Telegraph, Leyton High School, Leyton Elementary/JH, at various businesses in the community, and on the [www.leytonwarriors.org](http://www.leytonwarriors.org) website on or before Wednesday, April 6, 2022.

Members present: Ryan Borges, Lisa Carter, Suzy Ernest, Rol Rushman, Sam Schumacher, and Dave Wiedeman. Members absent: None. Also present were Superintendent Chris Geary and Elementary/JH Principal Dana Morgan. In addition, there were ten visitors.

There were no communications. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Moved by Wiedeman, seconded by Ernest to approve the agenda as presented. Roll call vote: Yes: Borges, Carter, Ernest, Rushman, Schumacher, and Wiedeman. No: None. Motion carried 6-0.

**REPORTS:**

Mr. Schumacher presented the Security/Crisis Committee report and thanked Mrs. Hansen for taking the minutes. The committee discussed the Mitigation Plan, school drills, and security/safety concerns.

Mr. Wiedeman presented the School Improvement report. The Cognia team visited last week and interviewed staff, parents, Board members, students, and administration. They observed classroom instruction and reviewed documentation. They will submit their report within 10 days and the District should have a final report in 4-6 weeks.

Mr. Borges discussed the 2022-2023 Staffing Plan. He has talked with Mr. McLaughlin, Ms. Primm and Mrs. Morgan and they feel they have come up with the best plan for next year. 1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup> grades will be combined as will 4<sup>th</sup>/5<sup>th</sup> grades. Mrs. Morgan will meet with her staff tomorrow and will report if there are any concerns with the plan.

Ms. Primm presented her report on Work-Based Learning and Career Education clusters. The Health Care cluster will be presented as an option next year and then other areas, such as business and welding, will be added. Our District will work with WNCC in getting college credits in those areas.

Mrs. Morgan presented the Elementary/JH Principal's report.

Mr. Plummer's Secondary Principal's report was available to the Board.

Mr. Geary presented the Superintendent's Report.



One final message....from the Superintendent's Desk.

"The joy is in the journey." I have preached this message for a number of years and done my best to practice this principle in my own life. The past four years at Leyton have taught me so much. I have developed some amazing relationships and experienced unprecedented success, both personally and professionally, during my time serving the students and families of the Leyton school district. As a lifelong learner, I've grown to appreciate and value reflection by taking time to ask some impactful questions: What did we set out to do? What has been accomplished? Were there any missed opportunities? What lessons can I take with me in the next leg of my journey? I'll use my last newsletter article to share some of these insights...

When I began at Leyton in July of 2018, the Board challenged me with two priorities; School Improvement and Student Achievement. At the time, our student achievement scores were low and unsatisfactory and the elementary/junior high school had received an accreditation report which put us on notice – Accreditation UNDER REVIEW. Issues needed corrected and quickly. With the support and VISION of the Board, but specifically Jed Benish, Cary Linton, Colleen Cruise, and Kevin Henke, we set out to define our priorities and plans for improvement. We implemented regular committee meetings and invited the community to participate in the process. Together with the principals, Dana Morgan and Nick Brost, here's what WE accomplished.

Test scores (Required by the State Dept. of Education) were recognized in the Bridgeport News Blade on December 8, 2021 as the BEST in the Panhandle – tied with Bridgeport! And our average ACT scores are, once again, finally above the state average!

We hosted our Cognia Accreditation review last month. We submitted a plethora of evidence documenting our work on School Improvement and the results showed we made huge strides. The review team specifically noted the strength of leadership. We are waiting for the final report, but we know that we will no longer be "UNDER REVIEW" but well above average!

The district's physical facilities are in the best shape they have been in the recent past. Here's a list:

- High School parking lot completely renovated – and finally useable
- High School halls, flooring, lighting ALL updated (Saving the district big money on utilities)
- Track and Football field completely renovated – and we are hosting three track meets, including DISTRICT TRACK – all of which boost our community economically
- Dalton gym floor completely refinished and Title Sponsors annually support the activities with over \$10,000 per year in DONATIONS – NOT TAXES
- Elementary playground secured with a fence to improve student safety
- Elementary halls, flooring, and lighting ALL updated (Another HUGE savings)
- Elementary Handicap Parking
- Kitchen improvements at both sites (Fume hoods, flooring, etc.)
- Curriculum Investments (Amplify Science and STS-Shop)
- Completely Renovated High School Science Classroom and Laboratory

The budget and finances are also strong! In spite of large, unplanned expenses, here's a look at the numbers:

- Tax Asking + State Aid: 2009-2010, \$3,302,201; 2021-2022, \$3,815,610 This is an average ANNUAL increase of 1.41%. (For reference: Inflation over the same period is 1.78%)

- General Fund Operating Expenses - GFOE (Per Audit): 2009-2010, \$3,727,308; 2020-2021, \$4,075,348  
This is an average ANNUAL increase (11 years) of 0.8% - less than half of the rate of inflation.
- Teacher Base Salary for 2021-2022 is \$35,750, up from \$27,750 in 2009-2010. This is an average increase (12 years) of 2.4%! The base salary for teachers has grown THREE TIMES FASTER than GFOE! And this is ONLY a raise in the base salary – not in actual salary costs – which are much higher when considering the increased costs of insurance benefits and placement on the salary schedule.
- As of the March Board meeting, the Depreciation Account balance is \$69,817, the Building Fund balance is \$221,981, and the General Fund balance is \$1,145,535.

I'm proud of what's been accomplished in the past four years! My dad always taught me to leave things better than I found them. The evidence shows that I've been able to accomplish that during my time here at Leyton. I'm grateful for everyone who invested in me, trusted me, and helped me lead our district in the fulfillment of the school's VISION: Unprecedented Success, Unparalleled Joy. In spite of the challenges we faced – we prevailed.

And now I will hand the baton to Mr. Matt McLaughlin, who will assume the role of Superintendent on July 1, 2022. The Board has already made some changes for next year. Here's some things that are on the horizon:

**Combined Classes:** First and Second Grade will be combined together, as will fourth and fifth grades.

**Lunch:** Food will likely be prepared at one site and delivered to the other.

**Staffing:** We are still looking for an FFA teacher – so far nobody has applied. Mr. McLaughlin will assume the role of elementary principal as well as superintendent. The high school principal/AD position has been advertised, but has not yet been filled. And there will no longer be a school nurse.
