President Ryan Borges called the regular school board meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The public was informed of the Open Meetings Act posted on the wall of the multi-purpose room. Publicized notice of the meeting was posted in the Sidney Sun-Telegraph, Leyton High School, Leyton Elementary/JH, at various businesses in the community, and on the www.leytonwarriors.org website on or before Wednesday, May 4, 2022.

School Closings and Late Starts Due to Weather/Road Conditions

In the event road or weather conditions make it necessary for the Leyton Public Schools to have a late start or cancel school for the day, the information will be broadcast on Sidney's KSID radio station and on Scottsbluff's KNEB radio station. These two stations have proven to be reliable and cooperative in relaying school closing information to the public.

KSID Radio (Sidney) is found at 98.7 FM and 1340 AM. KSID also posts school closing information on its website at ksidradio.com.

KNEB Radio (Scottsbluff) is found at 94.1 FM and 960 AM.


These stations will be called as soon as a decision is made regarding a late start/school cancellation. The information will generally be available by 6:30 am.

Occasionally a late start is changed to a cancellation when the weather and/or roads do not show the anticipated improvement. When a late start is announced, it is wise to stay tuned to KSID (or continue to check its website) or KNEB in the event the decision is made to close school entirely.

As always, families living in the rural areas of the Leyton district know the condition of the roads in their immediate area better than anyone. IF YOU DO NOT BELIEVE YOUR CHILDREN CAN GET SAFELY TO SCHOOL DUE TO WEATHER OR ROAD CONDITIONS, PLEASE KEEP THEM AT HOME AND NOTIFY THE SCHOOL THAT YOU ARE DOING SO.

Breakfast K-8: \$1.50 Breakfast 9-12: \$1.60 Lunch K-5: \$2.60


Lunch 6-8: \$2.75 Lunch 9-12: \$2.85

AHERA Notice

The Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) of 1987 requires all public and private schools to inventory and inspect all buildings in each system for asbestos-containing material (ACM). This initial inspection was conducted in 1988 and each subsequent three years.

School districts are required to develop and follow a management plan for asbestos in each building. Please be advised that these management plans are on file in the school's administrative office and are open for public inspection during office hours. Complete copies of the district's management plans are available for the cost of reproduction.

Each six months the school is required to have the ACM surveyed to determine if the asbestos material had deteriorated or been damaged in any way.

A listing of all the district's asbestos-containing material is located in the management plan and any action to remove or repair the asbestos is also listed in the management plan which is open to public inspection.

Foods & Nutrition Classes

Due to student interest, Leyton is offering Foods & Nutrition classes during the 2022-2023 School Year. Twenty-five students are registered as of this newsletter, and kitchen equipment is scarce to meet the needs of all these students. We have three stoves, and would like to get all three kitchen spaces equipped for the year. We are accepting donations of new and clean nearly new kitchen items to help students learn different cooking, baking and food preparation techniques. We cannot accept items that have damaged cords, flaking nonstick coating, or pose any kind of danger to students.

Suggestions include, but are not limited to:

- · Pots, pans, and skillets, with or without lids
- Baking dishes of all sizes
- Crockpots, small and large roasters, waffle irons, griddles, hand mixers and other electrical appliances that would teach students new cooking techniques
- Food prep items such as cutting boards, counter scrapers, storage containers with lids, and utensils (vegetable peelers, knives, etc.)

Other items students will need this fall:

- Jelly jars, lids and rings for sterilization and canning lessons
- Sweet corn to practice grilling, blanching and freezing techniques
- Fall produce such as zucchini, pumpkins, apples for baking projects
