

A note from the Superintendent,

I hope this message finds you well and you are thinking about fall leaves and the changing of the seasons. My message this month is about core beliefs and the process we have been using during the last month to find our core beliefs as a district. If you aren't familiar with core beliefs, I bet you know a guy who is famous for his core belief that simply stated "I'm the Greatest". Muhammad Ali was famous for that simple yet core belief, and that belief guided his career as one of the best boxers of all time. This last month we have been digging deep with our staff, community members, students, and families to come up with something that we believe can lead our district into the future.

The strategic planning process is what we are using to establish our core beliefs to impact change in our district. Our last step in this process is to get all of these components together and develop a report for our community to see. My goal is to market our district in a way that shows everyone in our community what "the plan" is and the steps we are taking to meet the specific goals of our community. We want to be "The Greatest" and I appreciate all of our community members who have taken an active role in developing our strategic plan. Our report is hopefully going to be ready by February from NASB, and then we will go through the final report and present it to the community.

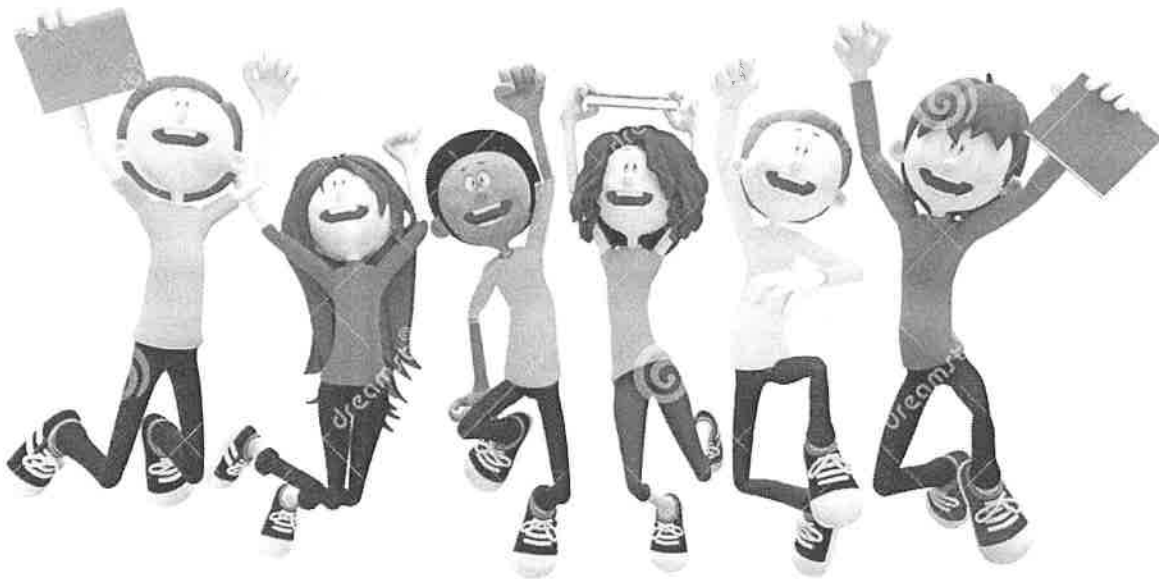
Notes from the Counselor

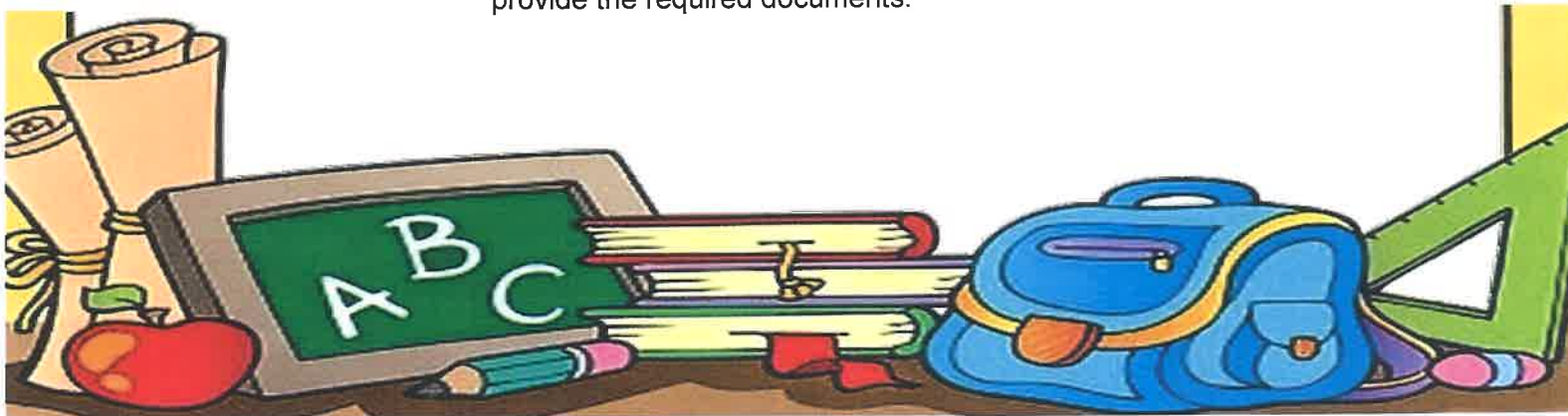

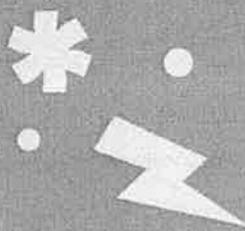

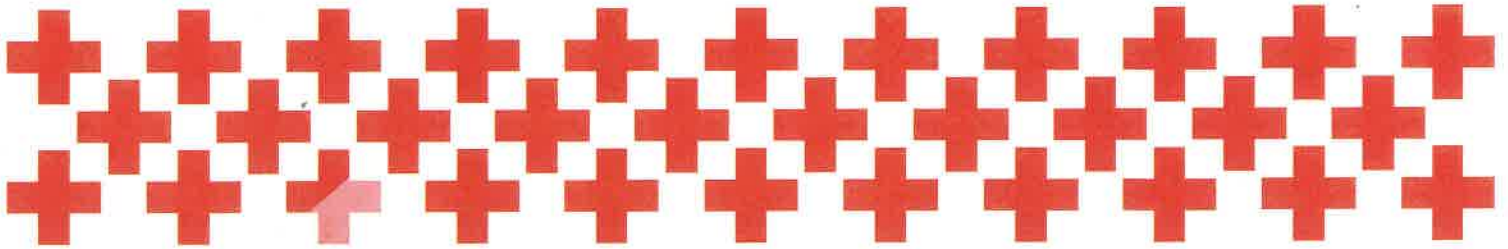
