


A note from the Superintendent,

I hope this message finds you well and you are beginning to think of the Holiday season. This month I wanted to talk about opportunities for our students here at Leyton Public Schools. Specifically, a program designed to help our students become more prepared for college and career readiness. We recently developed a plan to get our students in front of the ACT assessment at least four times throughout their time at Leyton. I wanted to talk about the program and elicit feedback from our community to help make this program something we can all be proud of.

When I was first starting in administration, I came across a document that has stuck with me for many years. The document has tons of powerful insights and is relatively easy to use. I'm going to share that document with you but the gist of it is that if you want change to happen, you have to have every component thought out. If you are missing a key component, your result will vary predictably.

Managing complex change



The Managing Complex Change model was created by Dr. Mary Lippitt (1987).

I try my best to stick to this document whenever I need to make a change or introduce something new at school. So this plan was no different.

We know that testing is only one component of a student's academic journey, some students are natural at testing and for others, testing can be very burdensome. As a district, we

recognize that the ACT assessment taken in high school can be a scary thing for students and an extremely high-stakes assessment, not to mention it's very expensive. Our school has developed a plan to ensure that our students can take the assessment confidently and have the opportunity to take the test more than one time throughout their high school careers. The first step in the plan was to purchase one ACT per student per year.

It's one thing to take the assessment, but an entirely different thing to have confidence in your ability to do well on a difficult assessment. The vision for this program is to ensure that all students can confidently take the ACT, so to be confident in their ability to score well on the assessment, they have to have the skills in place. What I liked most about our plan is that all teachers are on board with ACT testing prep, and we have a plan set in place to prep our students in all four content areas of the test. Historically we have done pretty well as a district in the area of math and science, and with our test prep this year we should be able to get our students scoring very well on the reading and language portion of the ACT. We don't want to teach to the test, we just want our students to be as prepared as possible so they can be confident in their ability to score well.

- -So we have a vision: ensure all students can confidently take the ACT
- -We have the skills our teachers know the program used for test prep and students have individual access to accounts for personalized study time
- -We have the resources: the district pays for the test, the district provides access to all test prep content
- -We have an action plan: register for the test by November 3, and complete testing prep before taking the national test on December 6.
- -What is left... an incentive. (Without this step we will have resistance according to my chart)

Besides paying for the assessment, our team wanted to create a scoreboard of testing accomplishments so that we could add names to the board over time and give our students something to shoot for when scoring well. The MAC conference has two distinct levels of ACT accomplishments: the Silver Club (Scores 26-29) and the Gold Club (Scores of 30 and above). This record board will be visible and kept permanently on the wall at Leyton High School. Charting scores, developing goals, and shooting to get your name on the board for life is something that we felt students would make their own. We will also be asking for community members to be involved in ensuring all names from the past are included on the lists. I know of two young men from last year's graduating class who scored 30+ and we will include those names on the record wall.

If we want to continue to keep our academic standards high and help our students continue to grow into young adults who can make and achieve goals, this plan is a great way of helping us narrow that focus. What we need most from our community is for you all to talk about the ACT plan, make a big deal out of the success of your students, but most important of all be proud that your student(s) attend Leyton Public Schools. 
