I hope this message finds you well and you are excited about the holiday season. I wanted to spend this month writing about family involvement and the importance of being involved in your community and with Leyton Public Schools. One area that I consistently try to see in newly hired staff is the family-like environment of our staff and our students. I believe that what makes Leyton special is the people who attend our school, the community members who promote our school, and the staff who work with the students each and every day. I wanted to talk about the impact that being involved in school has on your child and their educational journey. T

1. Students with parents actively involved in their education perform better in school.

What can I do: Reach out to your child's teacher and get acquainted with them and their expectations. This simple step shows your students that you are watching their work, you are in contact with the teacher, and most importantly, you value their education. What gets measured gets focused on, kids want you to pay attention, and when you do, they will be motivated to meet your expectations.

2. Students who have parents who are actively involved in their education behave better and have better social skills.

What can I do: Stay connected with the school, have a positive attitude about the school staff, and model appropriate behavior at home. We are blessed to have a really well-behaved student body, and that has everything to do with what they see at home each and every day. Parents are the first and often the best teacher our kids have.

3. Students who have parents that are actively involved in their education are less likely to miss school.

What can I do: Consistent attendance is a strong predictor of academic success, and parent involvement reinforces the importance of showing up and staying engaged. We all get the sniffles, but missing a lot of school genuinely impacts students and their ability to learn the content. No one wants to miss Halloween, but we should be worried about missing the day subtraction is covered more. If they do have to be gone, ask for homework and any help you might need.

4. Students who have parents that are actively involved in their education have increased self-confidence and self-esteem.

What can I do: When parents show interest in their child's education, it reinforces the child's self-worth. Knowing that their parents care about their schooling boosts confidence and self-esteem, helping them engage more actively in class and other school activities. You only live once, and childhood is short.



5. Students with parents actively involved in their education are more likely to graduate and pursue higher education.

What can I do: Engaged parents inspire their children to pursue further education. Consistent support from parents helps set expectations for future educational goals, increasing the likelihood that students will graduate high school and consider college or vocational training. Take advantage of the school's ACT program, go on college visits, talk with the counselor about scholarships, and focus on setting goals and celebrating success along the way.

I'm lucky, I work at school, and parental involvement has always been very easy for me to do because every day is "Bring Your Kid to Work Day". For those of you reading this, I hope you don't view this message as too preachy, lord knows I'm not the perfect father. What I do want you to know is that one day your son or daughter will be walking across the stage at graduation and those moments are supposed to mean something, they are meant to celebrate the hard work it takes to get that diploma. It's our job as a community to support and grow the best kids possible so our whole world is made better.

If you have any questions about family involvement or just want to be more involved in what we are doing here, please feel free to reach out. Also, I'm super proud of the accomplishments of students in fall activities, they represented our community in such a positive way, tons of Western Nebraska schools have reached out to tell me just how proud they were to see the Leyton Warriors getting attention on the state level. Thank you for helping us keep everyone safe and comfortable while we enjoy the winter weather!




The Giving Tree




