I hope this email finds you well and you are getting ready for a nice spring. This month's message will center around the track complex at Leyton. Our track is a fantastic addition to Leyton Public Schools, and we fully intend to use it for years to come. However, as with any major construction project, issues have emerged that require our attention to ensure the long-term quality and safety of the facility.

One of the primary concerns is the surface condition of the track. We have noticed areas of delamination, where the top pad layer is separating from the subsurface. These issues are most noticeable near the grandstand, where large cracks and peeling have appeared. To address this, we will be applying a structural spray this summer, which should hopefully repair cracks, divots, and surface imperfections on both the track and jumping runways.

Additionally, we have spent the past year gathering information on the track's design and construction process. One concern that has been raised is the placement of the fence, grandstand, and light poles, which appear to encroach upon a one-meter safety zone recommended for track facilities. We are actively seeking clarification on this issue to ensure the safety of all events held at the track.

Another major issue involves the base asphalt layer of the track. During construction, the surface was apparently milled—similar to what is done on highways—to help level the track. However, we have concerns about how this milling process will impact the long-term stability of the track. The additional materials used to resurface the track may expand and contract differently over time, potentially leading to more cracks and required repairs.


Due to these concerns, we have enlisted legal help to get answers and ensure that taxpayer dollars are being used responsibly to maintain the integrity of the track for decades to come. Legal fees are something we take very seriously, and our goal is to protect this investment for our students and community.

The Renaissance including Shakespeare

In recent ELA units, the 5th graders learned about the Renaissance as a cultural movement. This built on our learning from 4th grade about the Middle Ages and how the two consecutive time periods differed. We read about and viewed art pieces of renowned artists. We discovered how the upper class's mindset around art and literature allowed these artists to be successful as they served as their patrons. Each student researched a famous Renaissance artist and wrote a biography based on that figure. We showed our learning by creating a TIME magazine cover and article about our chosen Renaissance artist. This learning was followed up by exploring Shakespeare's, "A Midsummer Night's Dream". We focused on understanding the character traits, including character motivations. We used these important concepts to take part in readers' theaters where we had to develop our own stage directions. We also practiced showing our understanding of the characters through several writing prompts where we used creative writing to write from the perspective of the characters or artists working on a production of the play.

Everyone's Favorite: Fractions!

Math has been heavy on an all time favorite, FRACTIONS! We have been working with not only with basic fractions but also mixed numbers, improper fractions, converting between the two, finding common denominators, adding, subtracting, multiplying and simplifying them. We have been in a fraction frenzy! We are really seeing where previous math skills such as basic math facts and long division play a part in other math concepts.



Food Scientist

We have also been working as food scientists' to help develop a salad dressing that meets the criteria given to us by, "Good Food Inc." While the taste is an important part of the requirement, they must also find a recipe that has no sediment and does not separate. In order to accomplish this we have been engaging in both hands-on experiences and digital models to gather evidence about mixtures on the "nanoscale" and understand how molecules interact with each other.




