Every September, we launch into a new academic year filled with big hopes, ambition, and goals for our students. But as the initial excitement settles and the daily rhythm takes over, it is important to talk candidly about what it truly takes to reach those goals: **school is hard work, and success requires effort every single day.**

Think of a student's mind like a young plant.

When you place a seed in healthy soil, you don't dump a gallon of water on it once a month and expect it to bloom into a strong, resilient flower. If you leave it sitting without sunshine, water, and nourishment for days at a time, it simply will not grow into what you hoped for.

The human brain works the exact same way. Learning isn't about cramming the night before a test or doing a massive sprint once a week. Brain growth happens through small, consistent, daily interactions. Every single day a student reads a chapter, solves a math problem, asks a thoughtful question, or reviews past mistakes, they are watering that plant. When a day is missed, that growth stalls.

Meeting our district's high academic expectations is not something our teachers can do alone, nor is it something our students can carry by themselves. **It takes every single one of us—administrators, teachers, students, and families—working hard every single day.**

We know family schedules are packed, but nurturing your child's learning at home doesn't require hours of extra time. It just requires consistency. Here are three simple ways to make daily practice a non-negotiable habit in your home:

- **Attach learning to an existing routine ("Habit Stacking"):** Pair 10 to 15 minutes of school-related work with something your family already does every day—like reading right after dinner, practicing vocabulary words in the car during the morning commute, or reviewing math concepts while preparing a meal.
- **Create a dedicated, quiet "growth space":** Set up a consistent, distraction-free spot at home where study materials live. When your child sits there, their brain immediately knows it's time to focus, making it easier to jump right into the work.
- **Focus on daily effort over perfection:** Ask your child, *"What was something challenging you worked through today?"* rather than just *"Did you get an A?"* Celebrating daily grit reinforces the idea that hard work is how we build intelligence.

Great things are never built in a day, but they are built *daily*. Thank you for partnering with our schools, rolling up your sleeves alongside us, and helping us nourish our students' potential every step of the way. If you have any questions or need additional support, please reach out to our teachers or to me. I am in the same boat you are in, and I'm trying to practice this at my home so all my kids bloom into amazing flowers that we can all admire and look back on the hard work we put in every single day.

Importance of Early Literacy

Early literacy lays the foundation for a child's future learning and success. As children grow through PreK, kindergarten, and the primary grades, they develop important reading skills such as recognizing letters and sounds, listening for sounds in words, blending sounds together, reading words, and building fluency. These skills help children become confident readers and give them the tools they need to enjoy reading and succeed in school for years to come.

When we identify areas of difficulty early, we can provide additional instruction and practice before small gaps become larger challenges. Early intervention allows students to strengthen important reading skills while they are still developing, helping them experience greater success as they move through school.

At Leyton Public Schools, we use mCLASS DIBELS to help us understand how students are developing important early reading skills. DIBELS is a brief assessment that looks at specific skills that are important for learning to read.

DIBELS helps teachers:

- Identify students who may need additional reading support
- Pinpoint specific skills that need more instruction or practice
- Monitor student progress over time
- Adjust instruction based on what students need
- Provide early intervention before reading difficulties become more significant

DIBELS is not a grade or a test that students pass or fail. Instead, it gives teachers useful information about what a child can do independently and which reading skills may need additional support. **Our goal is simple: identify students' needs early, provide the right support, and help every child become a successful reader.**

mCLASS DIBELS is just one tool we use to understand and support each child's reading growth. We also consider classroom performance, other assessments, teacher observations, and progress over time. Students build reading skills through Accelerated Reader (AR), which encourages independent reading and comprehension. Our preschool students participate in 1,000 Books Before Kindergarten, and our local libraries in Dalton, Sidney, and Bridgeport provide wonderful opportunities, activities, and new books throughout the year to support a love of reading. A strong start in reading can make a difference for years to come. By identifying needs early and responding with targeted instruction, we can help students build the skills and confidence they need to become lifelong readers.
